Today we are celebrating **Trinity Sunday** which is the first Sunday after Pentecost to honour the Holy Trinity. The Trinity refers to the idea that God is one, but exists in three different Persons. The word 'trinity' comes from the word 'tri' meaning 'three' and 'unity' meaning 'one'.

Christians believe that there are three distinct persons to this one God and that these three persons form a unity. This belief is called the doctrine of the Trinity:

God the Father - the creator and sustainer of all things.

God the Son - the incarnation of God as a human being, Jesus Christ, on Earth.

God the Holy Spirit - the power of God which is active in the world, drawing people towards God.

The Trinity expresses the way Christians should relate to God:

worship God the Father, follow the example set by God the Son God and accept the Holy Spirit lives in us.
