

Sea Sunday - Today

The second Sunday in July is sometimes called "Sea Sunday" and is an opportunity for us to remember and say prayers for all the brave men and women who work at sea to make sure we have all that we need.

St John's Church has a special connection with the 'Mission to Seafarers', a Christian Charity who provide help for seafarers in over 200 ports around the world.

Seafarers need our help because they are often working in dangerous conditions with little or no support. Port Chaplains (usually ordained clergy) provide specialist help to seafarers who are often working many miles away from home.

Our connection with this charity is through the Revd Canon Ken Peters, who spent his ministry working for this charity in Japan, Liverpool and a Head Office in London. Ken lived in Stanmore and attended St John's Church (his wife Jackie still does). Sadly Ken died in 2020.

For many years, the PCC has made a donation to support the work of the charity (\pounds 2,000 in 2024). Most of the hymns today have a nautical theme!
