Archdeacon's Visitation Tuesday 7th October (7pm)

Every three years Archdeacons undertake a formal visitation where they visit one of the churches in their archdeaconry. They inspect all parochial registers and records. This month we are looking forward to welcoming Clive Scowen who is a Lay Minister at Christ Church Roxeth. He is also the Lay Chair of the Harrow Deanery Synod and works closely with Matthew in his capacity of Area Dean of Harrow.

Clive is long-standing member of the General Synod, the Church of England's Governing Body, as well as the Crown Nominations Committee (CNC). The CNC is responsible for selecting the next Archbishop of Canterbury and recommending names to the Prime Minister and King Charles III.
